## **NATIONAL PASSPORT DAY**

National Passport Day is on Saturday, 9 April 2011. The Academy will have a Passport Fair at the Community Center Post Office on that day, 9 April, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Bus service will be available for the cadets between Vandenberg Hall and the Post Office (5136 Community Center Drive) between the hours of 8:25 a.m. and 2:25 p.m. Pick up will be at the Vandenberg dock area.

Cadets must have original birth certificate and two picture I.D.'s. The cost for each cadet is \$15.00 for photo, \$25.00 for processing, and \$110.00 for the passport. Only cash or a check will be accepted. The passport takes 4 - 6 weeks but if it is needed sooner, the passport can be expedited for an additional cost.

## **BOOT ISSUE FOR APPOINTEES**

According to Boot Issue, the Academy is no longer supporting the purchase of boots in advance. The main reasons for no longer getting boots in advance are:

1. There is no break in period needed for the new boots.
2. The USAFA is funded for two pair of boots for each incoming appointee. If an appointee shows up with any other boots, they will be instructed to send them home or use them for personal use only.

If an appointee/parent is insistent about purchasing boots in advance, they may call boot issue at 719-333-3017.

## **CLASS OF 2015 BED & BREAKFAST PROGRAM**

The Association of Graduates (AOG), with the assistance of the Rampart Chapter of the AOG, provides bed and breakfast to appointees (for a minimal fee) who will be traveling alone to the Academy for in-processing.

The Bed & Breakfast program provides appointees the opportunity to stay at the home of Academy graduates, faculty, staff and friends. (Note: Some appointees will be selected to stay at the Cheyenne Mountain Resort in Colorado Springs. The Cheyenne Mountain Resort has been a generous community partner in offering to host 20 appointees for the Bed & Breakfast program. The appointee will be notified of this when s/he receives the confirmation call.) Last year, over 350 appointees participated in the program. Bed & Breakfast hosts are familiar with the Academy and offer encouragement and support to appointees.

Hosts will pick up their assigned appointees on Wednesday, June 22, at the Colorado Springs airport or Doolittle Hall (the AOG's building), and provide a place to stay, dinner, breakfast and transportation to Doolittle Hall for In-processing on Thursday, June 23.

Appointees who are already enrolled in the official Academy Sponsorship Program **are not** automatically enrolled in the AOG's Bed & Breakfast program. (The AOG Bed & Breakfast program is not affiliated with the official Academy Sponsorship Program.)

Appointees interested in participating in the Bed & Breakfast program must follow these instructions:

1. Arrange for airline transportation as directed by the Academy's Admissions office. You must have your airline ticket prior to registering for Bed & Breakfast.
2. Visit the AOG web site at [www.usafa.org](http://www.usafa.org) and click on "Bed & Breakfast" (lower left hand column). If you are unable to register on line, please contact Jennifer Ganzler at

719-472-0300, ext. 138, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (MST), or [jennifer.ganzler@aogusafa.org](mailto:jennifer.ganzler@aogusafa.org). The processing fee is \$10.00.

3. After registering for the Bed & Breakfast program, please wait for an AOG representative to call you in mid-June with the name and phone number of your host family. The AOG is unable to fulfill special requests for host families from specific states, cultural backgrounds, religions, etc.
4. After receiving your host family's information, contact them to finalize and confirm the arrangements of how and when they will meet you.

## **FALCON FOOTBALL**

Nathan Walker takes home top honor at annual football banquet.

Senior wins coveted Bullard Award.

Senior fullback Nathan Walker won the Brian Bullard Memorial Award, the highest honor a Falcon football player can earn, at the annual Air Force Football banquet at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs.

Walker helped the Falcons finish the season with a 9-4 overall record. Air Force was third in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 mark and earned a bid to the 2010 Advocare V100 Independence Bowl where the team defeated Georgia Tech, 14-7, to earn a second straight bowl win.

Walker finished fourth on the team in rushing with 470 yards, averaging 4.6 yards per carry. He was second on the team in rushing touchdowns with six. Walker, who played in every game, started the last six games of the season. He rushed for a career-best 109 yards and a touchdown against Army to post the first 100-yard game of his career. He also picked up a key third-and-21 with a 21-yard run to set up an Air Force touchdown. The 21-yard run was voted on as one of the top 10 plays of the year by the football support staff. Walker added 95 yards and a touchdown the following week against New Mexico.

A native of Colorado Springs, Walker graduated from Colorado Springs Christian School where he lettered four years in football and two each in track and wrestling. He is headed to Vance Air Force Base, Okla., following graduation for undergraduate pilot training.

The Bullard Award, established in 1984 and voted on by the football team, is based on the criteria that typifies the late Brian Bullard – unselfishness, 110 percent effort, total team commitment and pride in his role on the team whether he’s a starter or not. Bullard was a 1982 graduate of Air Academy High School in Colorado Springs. He attended the Academy the following year and played on the football team for two years. During Thanksgiving vacation in 1983, Bullard and his girlfriend, fellow cadet Dianne Williams, died from carbon monoxide poisoning while returning from a trip to Kansas in a snow storm.
